1. May 2022 Zoning and Building Permits

4. Construction Projects

a) Animal Rescue Center / Green Energy Park. Contractor has completed storm sewer installation. Concrete sidewalks and patios are being installed. Once sidewalks are complete then final grade and pavement can be applied to site. This should be finalized in the months of July & August. Majority of concreate upper paths are complete. Contractor is installing dog park fencing. These items should be completed in the month of July. The facility itself is 80-85% complete. Contractor will be working on finishes in the months of July & August. Furniture is scheduled to arrive in early August. Anticipated move in will be late August – early September. (Attachment 4a)

- b) The Fairview Press Box, Concession and Restroom construction will be completed on schedule. The contractor is working on fixing a small punch list of items to repair.
 The facility will be in full use by the end of June. (Attachment 4b)
- c) Jackson County is currently going through the process of requesting architectural qualifications for two recreation projects 1. Splash pad at the Cashiers-Glenville Recreation Complex 2. Qualla / Whittier community park. The responses are due by June 30, 2022. Recommendations will be brought to the Board during the July 12, 2022 work session. (Attachment 4c)
- d) A proposed architectural agreement with Clarknexsen will be presented to the Board during the July 12, 2022 work session for the design of the domestic violence shelter.

RE: Safety Concerns on US Highway 74 and the 2024-2033 Draft STIP

Mr. Cody,

We are contacting you regarding serious safety concerns on US 74 in the Barkers Creek Community in Jackson County. This section of highway has seen an alarming number of crashes in recent years. In the past five years alone, there have been six fatalities and 13 serious injuries between Dillsboro and the US 441 Gateway interchange. With an Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) of over 26,000 vehicles, the deficiencies of this road are putting people's lives at risk every day.

These safety concerns led Jackson County leaders on the Southwestern Rural Planning Organization and NCDOT Division 14 to prioritize improvements to US 74 during Prioritization 5.0. That project, R-5907, received strong public support and was successfully funded in the 2020-2029 STIP. The project would improve US 74 from US 441 Gateway Interchange to SR 1391 (West Piney Mountain Road), upgrading the existing median, improving turn lanes and crossovers, rehabbing pavement and replacing the Wilmot Bridge.

We believe that the R-5907 project is critical to improving safety and mobility not just for Jackson County residents, but for all travelers throughout southwestern North Carolina who use this route. Unfortunately, R-5907 is no longer funded for right-of-way or construction in the 2024-2033 Draft STIP. If possible, we would strongly prefer that this project retain full funding in the 2024-2033 STIP. It is a top priority based on the crash rate, traffic volume, and regional significance.

Knowing that it will take many years to implement the full-scale project, we would also like to request some immediate smaller-scale safety improvements to better address the most critical concerns and hopefully save lives until the R-5907 project can be built.








Two Jackson County Recreation Construction Projects

Introduction: Jackson County is seeking a qualified architectural firm to finalize schematic design, create construction/bid documents, coordinate bidding and provide construction oversight for two separate recreation construction projects. The two projects are as follows:

- 1. Construction of a new splash pad at the Cashiers-Glenville Recreation Complex.
- 2. Construction of a community park in the Qualla / Whittier area.

Project Description:

Splash Pad at the Cashiers-Glenville Recreation Complex

Jackson County recently completed a Master Plan for the Cashiers Recreation Complex in September 2021 (see attachment 1 – copy of plan). The master plan includes new elements such as a splash pad area, tennis courts, pickleball courts, exercise trails, outdoor meeting spaces and nature play areas. It is anticipated that the build out of these elements at the existing Complex will take place in phases.

The first priority/phase is to remove the existing dilapidated pool and build out a splash pad. The demolition of the existing pool and the construction of the new splash pad will need to be accomplished with the goal of building out the other identified Master Plan elements in the future.

Qualla / Whittier Community Park

Jackson County recently submitted a Parks and Recreation Trust Fund (PARTF) application (see attachment 2 – park plan and cost estimates). The County currently owns approximately 18 acres in the area. 11.15 acres will be made available for this park. The main purpose of the park is to provide outdoor, multi-use recreation opportunities to residents of the Qualla / Whittier area. Specifics of the park include a picnic shelter, restrooms, and structured playground, walking trails, ADA features, paved parking and additional natural amenities.

The statement of qualifications will be evaluated based on demonstration of meeting the requirements of this RFQ.

Proposal Content: Specifically, the proposal should address the following information tabbed in order. It is preferred that the digital copy be one file that contain sections organized in accordance with the tabs below. Otherwise each digital file submitted must have the corresponding tab label as part of its name.

<u>TAB 1</u>: Firm profile listing: name, address, year established, type of ownership, size of company and staff, and an organizational chart. Provide information regarding previous ownership if it has changed within the last five years.

<u>TAB 2</u>: Current firm workload and ability to perform work for this project. Firm proximity to and familiarity with the area where the project is located. No recommendations or conclusions from this RFQ process concerning respondents shall constitute a right (property or otherwise) under the Constitution of the United States or under the Constitution, case law or statutory law of North Carolina. Neither binding contract, obligation to negotiate, nor any other obligation shall be created on the part of County unless County and respondent execute a Contract.
