

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING JACKSON COUNTY'S APPPLICATION FOR THE NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S PAVED TRAILS AND SIDEWALK FEASIBILITY STUDY GRANT

WHEREAS, The North Carolina Department of Transportation's Integrated Mobility Division has announced the availability of Paved Trails and Sidewalk Feasibility Study Grants for local governments; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Paved Trails and Sidewalk Feasibility Study Grant is to improve the pipeline of bicycle and pedestrian projects accessing state and federal funding, resulting in successful implementation of projects led by communities prioritizing multimodal infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, Jackson County desires to apply for a grant to develop a feasibility study for a sidewalk on US 64 in the Cashiers community from the intersection of NC 107 east to the Ingles shopping plaza; and

WHEREAS, The Jackson County Board of Commissioners recognizes the numerous benefits of pedestrian facilities to the overall health, safety, and quality of life of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the creation of a sidewalk feasibility study on US 64 will assist Jackson County in implementing our 2021 Jackson County Walks Plan and Cashiers Small Area Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Jackson County Board of Commissioners has adopted ordinances that require sidewalk construction within the County's zoned districts and a policy to allow the County to maintain the sidewalks once constructed; and

WHEREAS, The Jackson County Board of Commissioners is committed to improving pedestrian safety in the County; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY OF JACKSON, that the County of Jackson is supportive of the application for the North Carolina Department of Transportation's Integrated Mobility Division's Paved Trails and Sidewalk Feasibility Study Grant for US 64 East.
