



**SUPPLEMENTAL DECLARATION OF A
LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY
REGARDING FACILITIES HOUSING JACKSON COUNTY OPERATIONS**

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020, the Governor of North Carolina declared a State of Emergency to coordinate the State’s response and protective actions to address the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (“COVID-19”) public health emergency and provide for the health, safety, and welfare of residents and visitors located in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, based on public health guidance from the World Health Organization, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the United States Department of Health and Human Services and the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Jackson County declared a Local State of Emergency on March 16, 2020 in an effort to promote social distancing to slow the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Jackson County issued a Supplemental Declaration of a Local State of Emergency on March 23, 2020 and a Modified Second Supplemental to Declaration of a Local State of Emergency on Monday, March 30, 2020 and a Superseding Declaration of a Local State of Emergency on Thursday, May 7, 2020 ; and

WHEREAS, in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic and for the purpose of protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the people of North Carolina, the Governor of North Carolina has issued Executive Order Nos. 116-122, 124-125, 129-131, 133-136, 138-144, 146 and Executive Order No. 147; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order NO. 147 requires North Carolinians to wear face coverings in public spaces, whether inside or outside, where physical distancing of six feet is not possible; and

WHEREAS, face coverings can decrease the spread of respiratory droplets from people, and evidence has grown, showing in numerous recent studies that the use of face coverings decreases the spread of COVID-19 within populations; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 147 strongly encourages local governments, such as Jackson County, to adopt similar policies that require Face Coverings.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of Jackson County under Article 1A of Chapter 166A of the North Carolina General Statutes and the Emergency Management Ordinance for the County of Jackson I hereby declare:

1. Jackson County remains under a State of Emergency as declared on March 16, 2020 and as declared in a Superseding Declaration of a Local State of Emergency on May 7, 2020. Jackson County remains subject to all of the Governor's Executive Orders.
2. As set forth in Executive Order No. 147 and in accordance with guidance from the Jackson County Health Director it is ordered that anyone entering the interior public space of a facility housing Jackson County operations must wear a Face Covering when they are or may be within six (6) feet of another person. This includes but is not limited to public spaces such as lobbies, hallways, and waiting areas where members of the public may be present. Clarification of public space to be made by the Jackson County Manager.
3. Exceptions. Face Coverings do not need to be worn by a person who:
 - a. Should not wear a Face Covering due to any medical or behavioral condition or disability (including but not limited to, any person who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious or incapacitated, or is otherwise unable to put on or remove the face covering without assistance);
 - b. Is under eleven (11) years of age;
 - c. Is actively eating or drinking;
 - d. Is strenuously exercising;
 - e. Is seeking to communicate with someone who is hearing-impaired in a way that requires the mouth to be visible;
 - f. Is speaking for a broadcast or to an audience.
 - g. Is temporarily removing his or her Face Covering to secure government or medical services or for identification purposes;
 - h. Would be at risk from wearing a Face Covering at work, as determined by local, state, or federal regulations or workplace safety guidelines;
 - i. Has found that his or her Face Covering is impeding visibility to operate equipment or a vehicle; or
 - j. Is a child whose parent, guardian, or responsible person has been unable to place the Face Covering safely on the child's face; or
 - k. Is working in a facility housing Jackson County operations and protected by an intervening barrier such as a plastic or glass shield or is working in interior office or working space not open to the public.
4. "Face Covering" means a covering of the nose and mouth that is secured to the head with ties, straps, or loops over the ears or is simply wrapped around the lower face. A face covering can be made of a variety of synthetic and natural fabrics, including cotton, silk, or linen. Ideally, a Face Covering has two (2) or more layers. A Face Covering may be factory-made, sewn by hand, or can be improvised from household items such as scarfs, bandanas, t-shirts, sweatshirts, or towels. These Face Coverings are not intended for use by healthcare providers in the care of patients. "Surgical Mask" means American Society for Testing and Materials ("ASTM") Level 1, 2 or 3 approved procedural and surgical masks. An N95 respirator approved by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health ("NIOSH") (or a respirator from another country allowed by the Occupational Safety & Health Administration, the Food & Drug Administration, or the CDC) is not recommended for general public use or use in public settings, as it should be reserved for healthcare providers and other medical first responders in

a health care setting. However, if worn, these respirators would meet both the Face Covering and Surgical Mask requirements of this Executive Order. A face shield that covers the nose and mouth also meets the Face Covering requirements of this Order.

This Declaration is in addition to the Executive Orders referenced above and should any provision hereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional by any court of any competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not affect the validity of this Declaration that as a whole or any part thereof which is not specifically declared to be invalid or unconstitutional.

We direct that copies of this Declaration be disseminated to the mass communications media for publication and broadcast and that a copy of this Declaration be posted at the Jackson County Justice and Administration Building and other public buildings as appropriate.

All of the terms and conditions of that said Local State of Emergency declared on March 16, 2020 and the Superseding Declaration of a Local State of Emergency declared on May 7, 2020 remain in full force and effect.

This Supplemental Declaration of Local State of Emergency Regarding County Owned and Operated Facilities for Jackson County shall begin on June 26, 2020 at 5:00pm and shall remain in effect unless terminated or modified as long as the Jackson County Local State of Emergency remains in force and effect.
