VA's New PACT Act is a law that expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits and other toxic substances. This law helps us provide generations of Veterans—and their survivors—with the care and benefits they've earned and deserve.

The Act

- (1) expands and extends eligibility for VA health care for Veterans with toxic exposures and Veterans of the Vietnam era, Gulf War era, and Post-9/11 era, and (2) expands eligibility for era, and Post-9/11 era AND
- (2) expands eligibility for benefits for Veterans exposed to toxic substances.

All Veterans and Survivors (even if previously denied) can NOW file claims for the below conditions - ACT NOW!

For Gulf War and post 9-11 Veterans, that includes:

- Brain cancer
- Glioblastoma
- Respiratory (breathing-related) cancer of any type
- Gastrointestinal cancer of any type Head cancer of any type Lymphoma of any type
- Lymphatic cancer of any type
- Neck cancer
- Pancreatic cancer
- Reproductive cancer of any type Kidney cancer
- Melanoma
- Asthma (diagnosed after service)
- Chronic rhinitis

- Chronic sinusitis
- obliterative bronchiolitis
- Emphysema
- Granulomatous disease
- Interstitial lung disease (ILD)
- **Pleuritis**
- Pulmonary fibrosis
- Sarcoidosis
- Chronic bronchitis
- COPD

For Vietnam Veterans and other Veterans exposed to tactical herbicides, that includes two Agent Orange presumptive conditions:

- Constrictive bronchiolitis or Monoclonal gammopathy of undetermined significance (MGUS)
 - High blood pressure (hypertension)
