

Jackson County Municipal Grant Application Form

Purpose

The purpose of the Municipal Grant Program is to assist the municipalities of the county with the implementation of worthy projects that will directly benefit not only the citizens of the municipality, but all the citizens of Jackson County.

Calendar

Applications for the Municipal Grant Program will be accepted until 5:00 pm on November 1, 2019. The Board of Commissioners will review the applications during the November work session and grant awards will be announced at the November mid-month meeting. Grant funds will be available after award.

Grant Amount Available

\$20,000 has been earmarked for the Municipal Grant Program. Individual grant requests are limited to a maximum of \$5,000 per municipality.

Project Name: Litter Awareness and Control
Project Description: <ol style="list-style-type: none">Litter Awareness Project: To create an impactful awareness about putting litter in its place and caring about our larger community, Forest Hills has teamed up with Prospect Western who lined up a welder to create a Litter Letter Project (for reference see www.TheLitterLetterProject.com) but our own idea is to create the 5 letters spelling out: WHEE♥ (See attached sketch of the Project.) This will be displayed on the community green space which will be visible from Hwy. 107 both North and South traffic, the WCU Ramsey Center area, and to anyone entering and exiting Forest Hills. The property owner and property manager of Prospect Western have donated their time to manage the project, Southern Concrete has donated the rebar for the project, WCU Eco Cats students have offered to help, but we'll need further funding to construct it. We plan to do a press release to all Western NC media once the project is complete.Litter Control: Forest Hills has a Community Roadside Litter Pickup event twice/year (in coordination with Jackson County's "Cleaning Up The Mountains" (See Current Announcements tab on our town website at www.VillageOfForestHills.org) To have a place to put trash on a regular basis other than on the ground, we'll place 2 outdoor trash cans along the areas where WCU's overflow from event guests park and where people walk on Stadium View Drive and North Country Club Drive on the corner of Hwy. 107. The trash cans match the picnic table awarded last grant cycle, have vandal-proof locking, and bonnet lids to keep out rain. See attached map for placement of trash cans. We checked with the NCDOT on placement, and we have community volunteers lined up to empty the trash bags on a regular rotating basis. The trash cans are a start to an attempt to control litter being carelessly placed elsewhere, but we plan to eventually morph them into separate recycle and trash bins.

What is the Litter Letter Project?

PRIDE | RESPECT | HOPE | CARE | THINK | WHY? | RETHINK | CHANGE | DREAM | IMPACT | REUSE | RECYCLE | BELIEVE | INSPIRE | TRASHFREE

A 3D messaging system of letters constructed from chicken wire and rebar, filled with litter collected from the roads and highways. By displaying these large scale visual messages in public places the hope is to provoke response, thought and action. The Litter Letter Project is a way to begin the conversation.

This project began as a personal response to the litter collected daily in front of my property along the highway in Louisiana. As a designer and educator with a deep love of 3D typography, I created a series of prototypes to test the idea of using the litter as the message. Following several community workshops and sharing this idea with a wider audience this project was awarded a generous grant from Keep Louisiana Beautiful (affiliated with Keep America Beautiful). Together as a community we created 7 litter letter words that were displayed in several locations around WASHINGTON PARISH, LOUISIANA throughout 2013. Since then The Litter Letter Project has been adopted by many communities and organizations across the USA and the world.

2014 ~ Keep Sevier Beautiful in PIGEON FORGE, TENNESSEE created their own version as part of their litter awareness month. Keep Phoenix Beautiful incorporated The Litter Letter Project into the day of action for day 3 of the Clinton Global Initiative University conference. Colorful letters filled with recycled materials were created for the PHXRENEWS site in downtown PHOENIX, ARIZONA. 6th Avenue Corridor/Keep Iowa Beautiful created the words THINK, HOPE and CARE in DES MOINES, IOWA and The Cultural Alliance of York County partnered with the community of YORK PENNSYLVANIA to create an amazing CHANGE. In the fall of 2014, LAFAYETTE, LOUISIANA created the tallest Litter Letters to date. Standing at 8 feet tall #YARDWORK was part of the parish wide Project Frontyard initiative.

2015 ~ Keep West Baton Rouge Beautiful became the 3rd region in Louisiana to create Litter Letters displaying WHY? in the state capital of BATON ROUGE. Keep Sevier Beautiful debuted their second word of THINK recently in PIGEON FORGE, TN and Keep Iowa Beautiful created the word DREAM making this the 4th Litter Letter installation in DES MOINES. A second region in Pennsylvania created the word PRIDE in downtown COLUMBIA. LANCASTER became the third region in PA to create Litter Letters debuting their RETHINK letters in October 2015.

2016 ~ Keep Sevier Beautiful continued their Litter Letter Projects debuting their 3rd annual word - PRIDE in March in PIGEON FORGE, TENNESSEE and the community of DES MOINES, IOWA produced their 5th Litter Letter project, also the word PRIDE. Keep Chadron Beautiful created WHY in May 2016 making NEBRASKA the 6th state to adopt the idea! A large traveling recycle symbol Litter Letter ♻️ debuted in PITTSBURGH, PA forming part of Allegheny CleanWays and PRC's larger "Northside's keep it clean" campaign to fight litter and increase recycling in Pittsburgh's Northside neighborhoods and became the 4th city in PA with Litter Letters. The Litter Letter Project went INTERNATIONAL when the community of Swan Valley in PERTH, WESTERN AUSTRALIA created Litter Letters that spelled out WHY? and then the city of ALBANY created REUSE and RECYCLE!

2017 ~ In the Spring, a 7ft tall Fleur de lis Litter Letter was created to raise awareness about items that could be recycled on the campus of Spring Hill College in MOBILE making this the first Litter Letter in ALABAMA! In the summer, Litter Letters debuted in BRISTOL, ENGLAND becoming the third continent to adopt the project! Litter Letters were also created in BALTIMORE, MARYLAND to become the 8th state in the USA with a Litter Letter project. In the Fall Litter Letters debuted in FINKE, (APUTULA), a remote indigenous community in the Northern territory of AUSTRALIA! In November 2017, Litter Letters were created in CEBU in the PHILIPPINES, the first in Asia to become the 4th continent to adopt the idea! Also in November the Litter Letter Project received the ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY AWARD at the AIGA (Re)Design Awards in St. Louis, MO. Thank you AIGA (American Institute of Graphic Arts) St. Louis for the honor. This award goes out to all the communities to date that have created Litter Letters as a tool to address the environmental issue of litter and recycling.

2018 ~ Mesker Park Zoo & Botanical Gardens in EVANSVILLE, INDIANA debuted their ZOO Litter Letters for their party for the planet on Earth Day! Indiana is the 9th US state to adopt the project! The ReThink Litter Letters made in Lancaster, PA in 2015 continue to be recycled and were put on display at Ecore International for their Earth Day events. The WHY? Litter letters created in PERTH, Western Australia in 2016 continue to be used for events and were recently refilled and put on display in a new location in the city. CALIFORNIA became the 10th state to adopt the Litter Letter Project creating CARE in the city of San Bruno. In October 2018 INSPIRE litter letters were created in Pikes Peak, COLORADO SPRINGS, COLORADO. #TrashFreeDC Litter Letters also debuted in WASHINGTON DC and were on display in Anacostia National Park for the Year of the Anacostia.

2019 ~ FLORIDA became the 13th US state to adopt the Litter Letter project when KPB litter letters were made in Pensacola by Keep Pensacola Beautiful. The #trashfreeDC Litter Letters made last fall in Washington DC were placed on display in front of the World Bank on Pennsylvania Avenue in DC for Earth Day. Litter Letters debuted in NORTHERN IRELAND in the Spring! 5ft. tall THINK litter Letters created by Belfast City Council were on display at Belfast Spring Fair and will travel to several events this summer around Belfast. Love Your Street of Hull City Council with students from Hymers College made litter letters to create litter awareness in HULL, ENGLAND. The #LOVEHULLHATELITTER letters were recently on display at Hull City Marathon. The Litter Letter Project was awarded an honorable mention in the 2018 London International Creative Competition. The project recently made it on to its 5th continent when Stop Don't Drop created Litter Letters in Abuja, NIGERIA, AFRICA for the Amazing Race Cleanup!

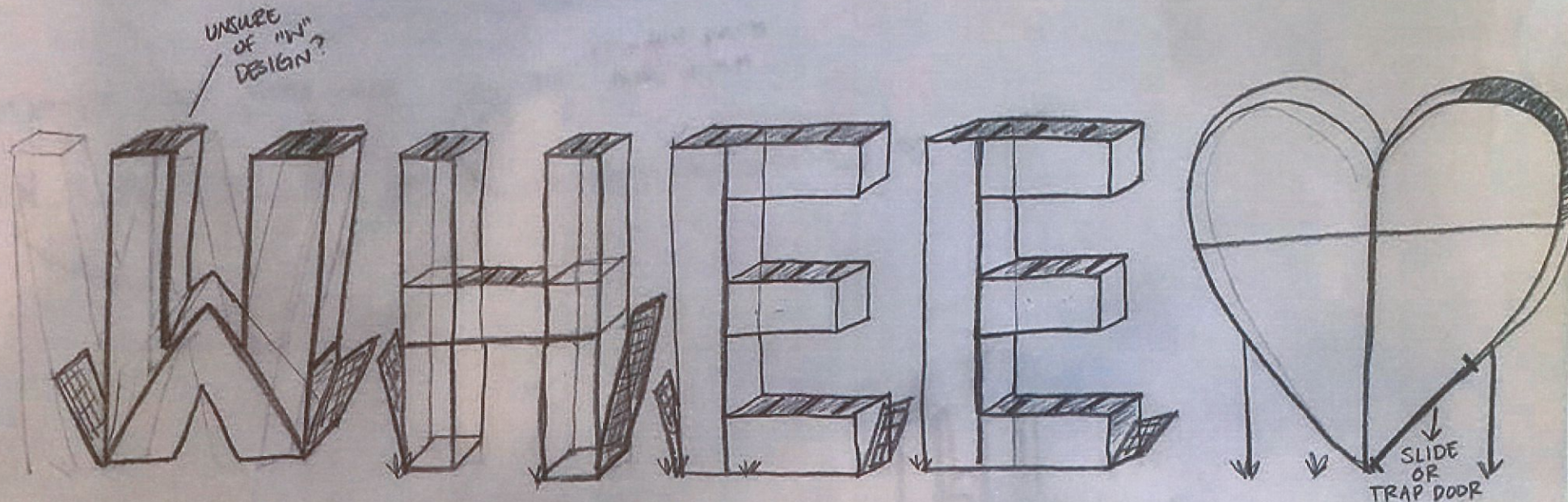

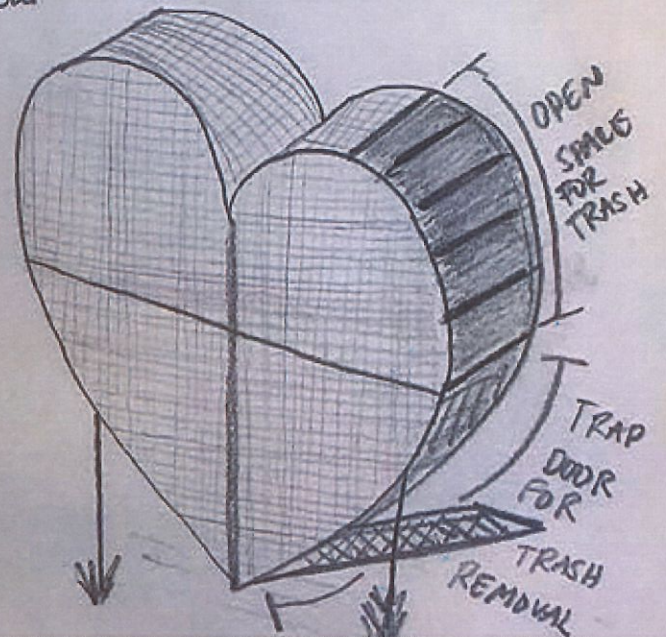

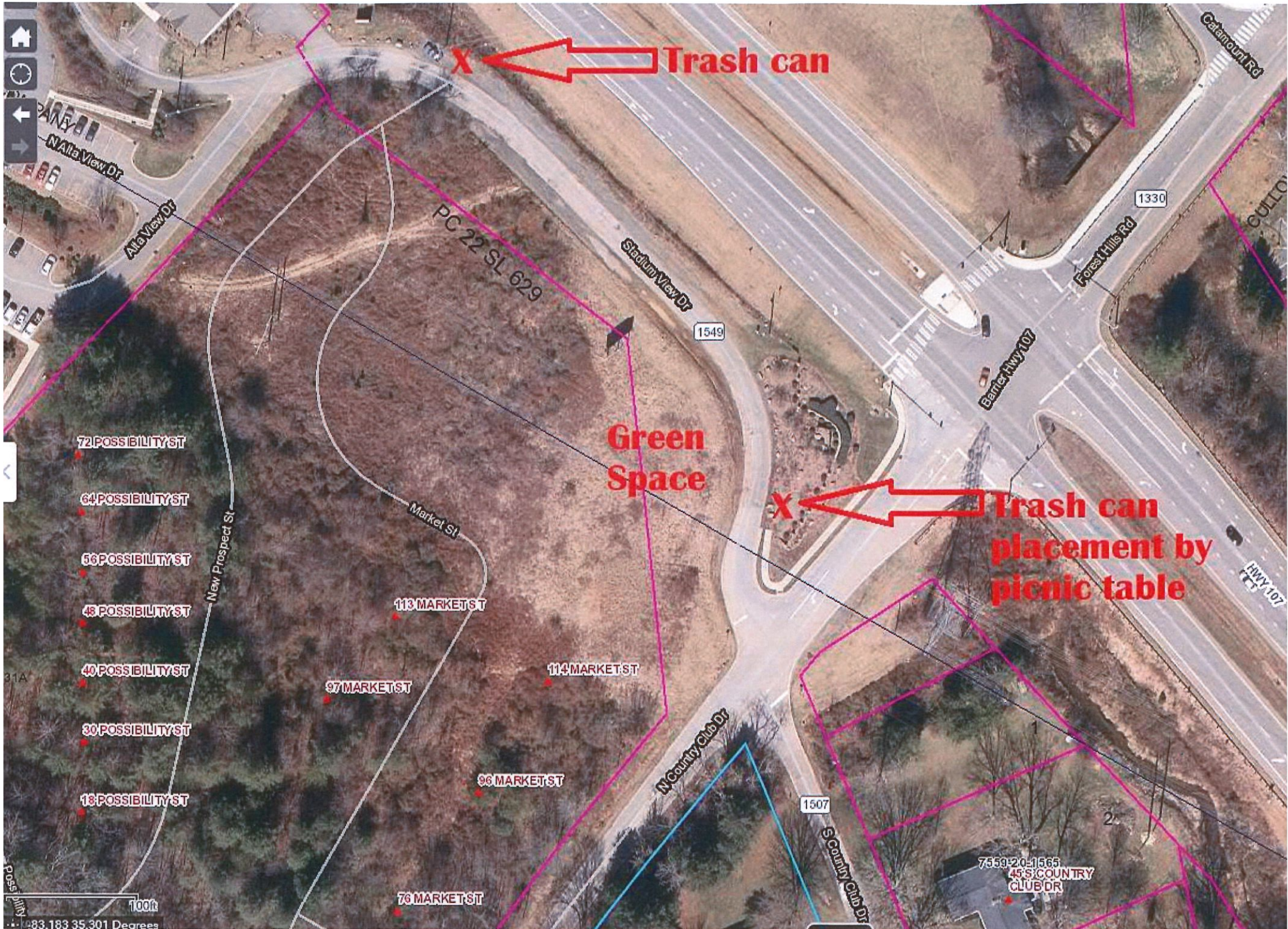
