1.	Renovation to Cashiers Inspection Office: Update office to include ADA restrooms, covered
	accessible entryway, improvements to energy efficiency, and roof repairs.
	Estimated Cost - \$175,000 (Funds Available in FY 15-16 Budget)
2.	Renovations to Skyland Services Center for Cooperative Extension and Soil and Water.
	Renovate remaining space formerly used as retail space by the original owner. Cooperative
	Extension and Soil Water would have space for current and foreseeable future needs. This
	would free up the space they currently occupy in the Community Services Center that could
	possibly be renovated for Inspections/Code Enforcement and Planning. The plans as drawn
	would have 1497 sq. ft. of undesignated space and space for a commercial kitchen.
	Estimated Cost - \$2,032,946 (Includes \$150,000 allowance for commercial kitchen equipment
	and \$74,370 for other furniture and fixtures). (Funds Available in FY 15-16 Budget)
3.	Renovate Old Rescue Squad Building: This building would be converted into a public meeting
	space and multi-purpose space for community use. In addition, the earth bank behind the
	building would be stabilized and the outside of the building would be enhanced.
	Estimated Cost - \$400,000
4.	<b>Green Energy Park Arts Building – Phase 1</b> – Renovate a portion of the existing steel structure
	to add 2557 sq. ft. for space to accommodate potters, glazing/spray area, kiln area, and
	restrooms.
	Estimated Cost - \$443,000.
5.	Improvements to Parking Lot at Department on Aging and add additional parking at DSS: The
	existing gravel parking lot adjacent to the Heritage Dining Room would receive drainage, curb
	and guttering, and pavement. This is the primary parking for all special functions held in the
	Heritage Dining Room. Additional parking for DSS staff would be provided.
	Estimated Cost - \$275,000
6.	Animal Shelter: Acquire property and construct a new animal shelter. This is a preliminary
	estimate until needs assessment has been conducted.
	Estimated Cost: \$2,500,000
7.	Health Department: Acquire property and construct a new health Department (38,000 sq. ft. *
	\$250 per sq. ft.)
	Estimated Cost - \$9,500,000
8.	Community Parks and Greenway Expansions: Provide funds to complete the Savannah
	Community Park, the Qualla Community Park and have a reserve for future greenway
	expansions.
	Estimated Cost - \$250,000
9.	<u>Indoor Swimming Pool</u> : This project is the number one item on Recreation Advisory Committee
	priority list and was number one on recreation survey.

	and provide new furniture and updated technology. Renovate existing law library space into

	evaluated all existing structures of the Jackson County Public School system and identified the
	critical facility needs for the entire system as well as the athletic improvements at Smoky
	Mountain High School to complete the master plan of that campus. The projects totaled
	\$14,618,094 and \$1,686,528 was provided in the FY 15-16 budget leaving an unmet need of
	\$12,931,566. Of this amount, approximately \$3.2 million is allocated for athletic
	improvements at Smoky Mountain High School.

Mr. Wooten and Jackson County Board of Commissioners,

Southwestern Community College respectfully submits the following list of capital projects for SCC Jackson Campus for your consideration over the next five or more years. SCC would like to retain the right to add to or make revisions as necessary to the submitted list.

New Health Science Occupation Building- The Balsam Building was built 30 years ago when SCC had only 4 HSO programs, and today the college is home to 15 programs and awaiting approval for one additional program. To accommodate our growth, faculty office space was created in a heavily-traveled corridor. SCC relishes the fact it has an outstanding reputation for its HSO programs as students travel to study at SCC from as far away as Graham County to the West and McDowell County to the East.

Cost: \$16,314,000

**Renovate Balsam Building-** A new HSO building would allow the renovation of antiquated science classrooms and labs to 21st century real-world educational and training environments to accommodate the growing demands for healthcare professionals and STEM-trained employees. This would also allow SCC provide a topnotch educational experience for College Transfer students.

Cost: \$5,000,000

**New PreEngineered Maintenance Building-** The present Maintenance building is extremely overdue for replacement. It is a very old building. A new Maintenance building would also allow SCC to relocate Shipping and Receiving from the top of campus to a more-centralized location at this new building, keeping delivery trucks out of congested student pedestrian and vehicular traffic areas.

Cost: \$700,000

**Renovate Summit Building-** Relocating Shipping and Receiving to a new Maintenance building would allow SCC to renovate the Summit building, allowing the College to expand the Welding and HVAC programs to meet growing program needs.

Cost: \$482,000

**New Library/Oaks Building Renovation-** Renovation to the Oaks Building would allow SCC to replace the current mechanical system and upgrade the electrical system to meet present needs and provide room for the new Library addition. A new Library would expand educational opportunities and enhance the Learning Resource Center already located in Oaks.

Cost: \$6,494,000

**Renovate Holt Library-** Building a new Library would allow SCC to renovate the existing Holt Library and create a Workforce Innovations and Economic Development Center. This new facility would house the Small Business Center, Customized Business and Industry, Continuing Education and the Personal Enrichment and Professional Licensure departments.

Cost: \$1,000,000

New Faculty Program Office Addition- New faculty offices would enable faculty the office space to meet programs needs. Faculty are currently utilizing closet space, storage space and doubling-up in shared space. Cost: \$1,006,000

College Signage- New College entrance and way-finding signage.

Cost: \$250,000

Total: \$31,246,000

SCC will provide the Jackson County Commissioners with a final Master Facilities Plan document once it is received from the Architect.

Attached you will find a list of roof repair/replacement needs and HVAC needs for our schools. These needs are prioritized within each school list, and the top 10 for the district have an \*\* after the cost. In discussing cost, please note that these costs are strictly estimates from the Cort Critical Needs Plan. We have added an emergency contingency line to hopefully mitigate cost increases.

Jackson County Schools is extremely grateful for the annual allocation of \$235,000 to provide for preventive maintenance for our nine school buildings and replacement/repair of equipment and maintenance vehicles. We request you maintain this allocation, so that minor repairs can be accomplished each year and negate the need for future, massive critical facility needs repairs that we each face at present.

It is our plan to obtain one engineer for the roofing projects and one engineer for the HVAC projects through appropriate bid and quote guidelines. The engineers will bid these projects. This will assist the system in allowing our licensed purchasing agent, assistant superintendent, and maintenance director to oversee the bids and project work. As you are well aware, our maintenance staff needs to focus on the preventative maintenance of the buildings.

Thank you in advance for considering our critical facility needs in the areas of roofs and HVAC systems.
