Chairman Debnam called the public hearing to order and stated the purpose was to receive public input on a proposed Ordinance Designating the Hooper House as a Local Historic Landmark.

Gerald Green, Planning Director, gave a brief history of the Hooper House which was built in 1906. The Historic Preservation Commission recommends that the "Hooper House" located at 733 W. Main St., Sylva, be designated as the first locally designated historic landmark. The designation reports and supporting documents have been reviewed by the State Historic Preservation Office and concurs that it would be suitable as the county's first locally designated historic property. The designation requires that any renovations, additions, upgrades, etc. must be approved by the Historic Preservation Commission. The local non-profit owners have requested a 50% reduction in the ad valorem tax.
